



# Newsletter Producer Price Index (PPI) - November, 2008



Republic of Ghana

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## Producer Price Index November, 2008

The Producer Price Index (PPI) for Ghana measures the average change over time in the prices received by domestic producers for the production of their goods and services. The PPI reports the price indices with reference to September 2006, the base period. This release shows the monthly index level, as well as the annual and monthly per cent change in the index level, for all industry (total industry) and three major sub-sectors covered namely: mining and quarrying, manufacturing and utilities (electricity, gas and water).

### Overall PPI and Inflation in Industry

The November 2008, all industry PPI was 155.65. The annual percentage change in the PPI (that is percentage change for all industry, between November 2007 and November 2008), which measures inflation in prices of goods at production level was **19.35** per cent for November 2008. This implies that ex-factory prices for all industry, which includes manufacturing, mining and quarrying and utilities sub-sectors were on average 19.35 per cent higher in November 2008 than they were in November 2007. This represents drop of 16.74 percentage points in inflation over that of October 2008 (table 1).

### PPI and Inflation by Sub- Sectors in Industry

The November 2008 PPI for the three major sub-sectors were: mining and quarrying, 191.59;

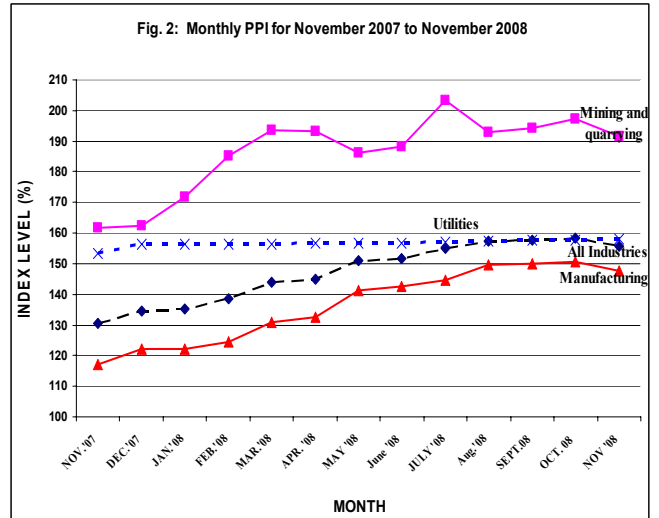
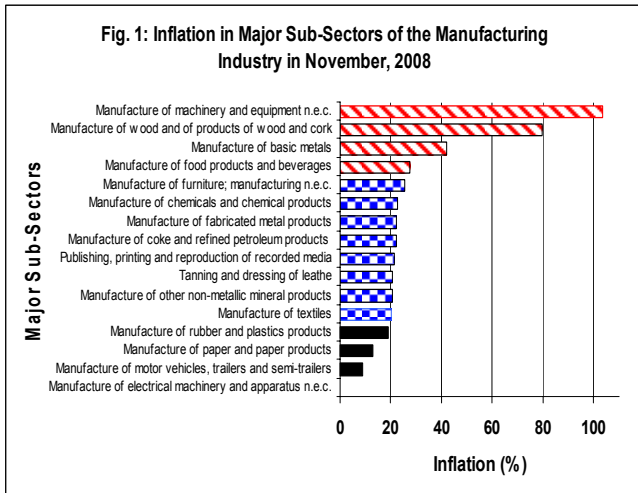
manufacturing, 147.50; and utilities, 157.89 (table 3). The percentage change in the PPI for November 2008 relative to November 2007, that is the rate of inflation for these sub-sectors were: mining and quarrying, 18.54 per cent; manufacturing, 25.63 per cent; and utilities, 2.99 per cent (table 1).

The rate of producer price inflation in November 2008 compared to October 2008 for mining and quarrying, manufacturing and utilities sectors dropped by 22.85, 7.72 and 42.02 percentage points respectively. In the manufacturing sub-sector, fourteen out of sixteen of the major groupings showed appreciable increases of at least 10 per cent, in their index level, ranging from 12.85 per cent (Manufacture of paper and paper products) to 103.60 per cent (manufacture of machinery and equipments n.e.c) (table 3).

### Monthly PPI and Percentage Change in PPI

The monthly change in the all industry PPI for November 2008 (i.e., the percentage change in the PPI between October 2008 and November 2008), was -1.77 per cent. The corresponding changes for the major sub-sectors were: mining and quarrying -2.85%; manufacturing, -2.61%; and utilities, 0.10% (table 2).

The fall in the index for mining and quarrying is strongly associated with the fall in the prices of metal ores which represent 95% of the output of the sub-sector. But for manufacturing, the manufacture of petroleum products which dropped by 12.2 percent contributed largely to the fall in the index level, with only four out of eleven subgroups that contributed at least 4 per cent each to the total manufacturing output (weight), having increases of at least 1 per cent in their index level. These subgroups are: sawmilling and planing of wood; manufacture of products of wood, cork, straw and plaiting materials; manufacture of grain mill products, starch products, and prepared animal feeds; and production, processing and preservation of meat, fish, fruit, vegetables, oils and fats (table 3).

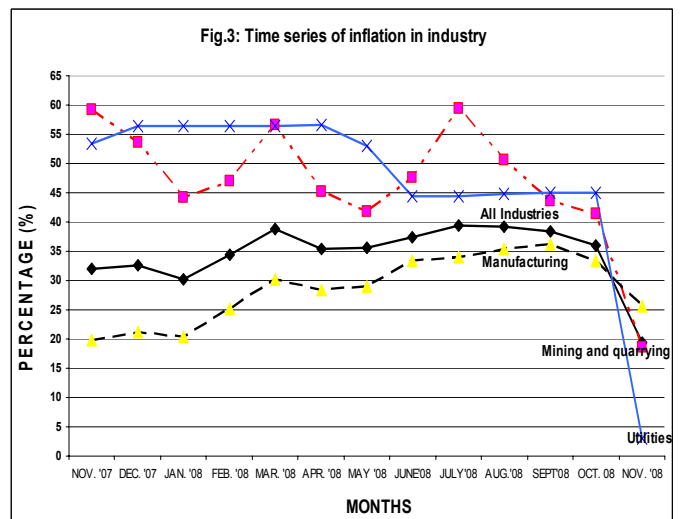

### Thirteen - Month Producer Price Movements

The year-on-year inflation from the producer's perspective for all industry and manufacturing was rising steadily, until October 2008 when it nose-dived. Within the same period, inflation in the mining industry remained unstable, recording three month cyclical fluctuations, until July 2008 when it consistently continued to fall. During the month of November 2008, the inflation in the manufacturing sub-sector for the first time recorded the highest inflation, with utilities recording the lowest (fig. 3).

## Brief Explanation of Producer Price Indices

The Producer Price Index (PPI) for Ghana is an index that measures the average change over time in the prices received by domestic producers of goods and services. The PPI measures price change from the perspective of the producer. This contrasts with other measures, such as the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which measures price change from the purchaser's perspective. Producers' and purchasers' prices can differ due to government subsidies, sales and excise taxes, and distribution costs.

Prices for approximately 950 items are collected from 209 establishments each month. The Producer Price Indices are available for virtually every industry in the mining, manufacturing, and utilities sectors of the Ghanaian economy. Plans to expand coverage to include telecommunications, construction, services, and agriculture are planned for the future.

The PPI is based on the selling price reported by establishments of all sizes selected by cut-off sampling techniques. Individual items and transaction terms from these establishments are chosen in consultation with the individual establishment. Establishments give the actual transaction prices at the time of the order. Prices submitted by survey respondents are effective on or near the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the month. This survey is conducted using enumerators who visit each establishment to collect the prices.

Price data are provided on a voluntary and confidential basis; only accredited GSS staffs are allowed access to individual establishment price reports. The GSS publishes price indices instead of unit value prices. The PPI is subject to revision three (3) months after the original publication to reflect the availability of later reports and corrections by respondents.

## Calculating Index Changes

Movements of price indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as per cent changes, rather than as changes in index points. Index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period, whereas per cent changes are not. The following example shows the computation of index point and per cent changes.

### *Index point change*

All Industries Price Index	107.5
Less pervious index	104.0

### *Index per cent change*

### **Availability of PPI Data**

PPI data will be made available each month via a press release on a Friday on or before the 28th of the month following the month for which price data were collected. Data will also be available via the GSS internet site at [www.statsghana.org.gh](http://www.statsghana.org.gh) Detailed monthly data will be published in a bulletin each quarter.
