### Construction Producer Price Inflation Rate in January 2024 is 40.2% The Construction Producer Price Index The inflation in the construction of building

The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures the average change over time in the prices received by domestic producers to produce their goods and services. The PPI for Ghana reports the producer price indices with index reference of March 2020 – February 2021 = 100. This release shows construction's annual (year-on-year) and monthly producer inflation rates. The C-PPI figure for January 2024 is provisional and is subject to revision when additional data becomes available. All other indicators are final.

#### January 2024 C-PPI

The rate for Construction Producer Price inflation for January 2024 was 40.2 percent. This rate indicates that between January 2023 and January 2024 (year-on-year), the C-PPI increased by 40.2 percent. This rate represents a 5.8 percentage point decrease in producer inflation relative to the rate recorded in December 2023 (46.0%). The month-on-month change in the C-PPI between December 2023 and January 2024 was 0.2 percent (Table 1).

The inflation in the construction of buildings subsector increased by 1.9 percentage points over the December 2023 rate of 8.8 percent to 10.7 percent in January 2024. The rate for the civil engineering sub-sector decreased by 10.8 percentage points to 56.5 percent in January 2024. The specialized construction activities subsector recorded a 6.9 percent inflation rate for January 2024 compared with 7.3 percent in December 2023.

#### **Civil Engineering Sector**

In January 2024, the construction of roads and railways recorded the highest inflation in the Civil Engineering Sector, with 56.6 percent. Construction of utility projects increased by 4.3 percentage points to 20.4 percent (Fig. 1).

#### **Specialized Construction Sector**

The inflation rate for Building completion and finishing in the specialized construction industry increased by 0.8 percentage points to 4.0 percent in January 2024 after recording 3.2 percent in December 2023. Other specialized construction activities increased by 3.5 percentage points in January 2024 from 16.0 percent in December 2023. The electrical, plumbing, and other construction installations recorded an inflation rate of 6.7 percent in January 2024, a decrease of 0.5 percentage points (Fig 2).


#### **Highlights**


The year-on-year producer inflation for construction was 40.2 percent in January 2024; the monthly change rate is 0.2 percent.

The civil engineering sub-sector recorded the highest year-on-year producer price inflation rate of 56.5 percent, followed by the construction of buildings sub-sector with 10.7 percent. The specialized construction sub-sector recorded the lowest year-on-year producer inflation rate of 6.9 percent.

The construction of buildings sub-sectors recorded the highest monthly inflation rate of 1.1 percent, followed by the specialized construction activities sub-sector recorded 0.5 percent. Civil engineering had the lowest inflation rate of -0.2 percent in January 2024.
