## Inflation Rate for June 2016 is 18.4%

### The Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in 2012, the base year, which has an index of 100.

### June 2016 rate of inflation

The year-on-year inflation rate as measured by the CPI stood at 18.4 percent in June 2016, down by 0.5 percentage point from the 18.9 percent recorded in May 2016 (Table 1). This rate of inflation for June 2016 is the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) over the twelve-month period, from June 2015 to June 2016.

The monthly change rate for June 2016 was 1.3 percent compared to the 1.1 percent recorded for May 2016.

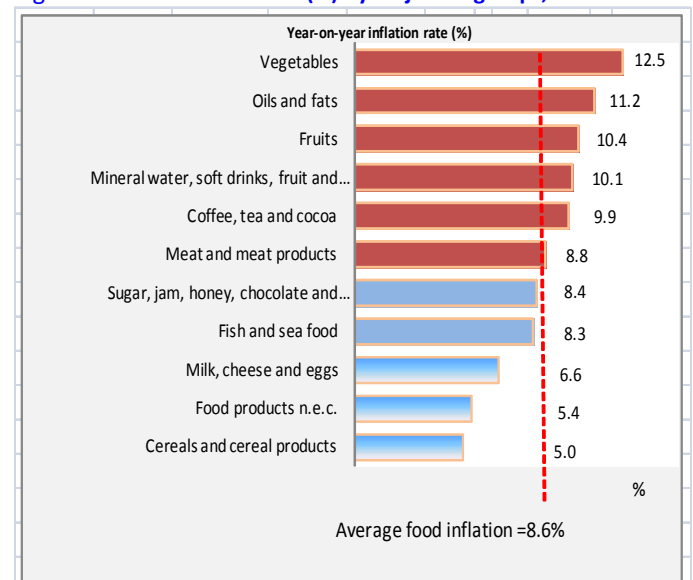
### Food and non-food inflation

The **Food and non-alcoholic beverages** group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 8.6 percent. This is 0.1 percentage point higher than the 8.5 percent recorded in May 2016. Six subgroups of the food and non-alcoholic beverages group recorded inflation rates higher than the group's average rate of 8.6 percent (Figure 1).

The **non-food** group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 24.1 percent in June 2016, compared to the 25.0 percent recorded for May 2016. Four subgroups recorded year-on-year inflation rates higher than the group's average rate of 24.1 percent (Figure 2). **Transport** recorded the highest inflation rate of 40.3 percent, followed by **Education** with 33.3 percent, **Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels** with 32.8 percent, and **Recreation and Culture** with 27.4 percent. Inflation was lowest in the **Communication** subgroup (12.5%).

## Regional differentials

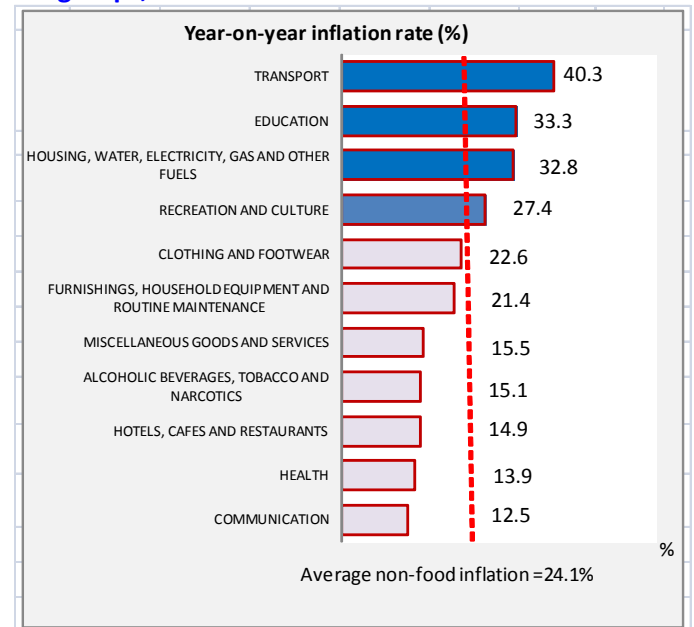


Figure 3: Year-on-year Inflation rate (%) by region, June 2016

At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 13.8 percent in the Upper East Region to 22.4 percent in the Greater Accra Region. Two regions (Greater Accra and Ashanti) recorded inflation rates above the national average of 18.4 percent (Figure 3).

## Dissemination

A bulletin on the June 2016 CPI and more detailed data in time series format have been posted on the GSS website [www.statsghana.gov.gh](http://www.statsghana.gov.gh). The target publication date of the monthly CPI newsletter is the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. It is released on the second Wednesday of every month, or on the third, when the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month falls on Wednesday. The next release date is 10<sup>th</sup> August 2016.

Figure 2: Year-on-year Non-Food Inflation (%) by major subgroups, June 2016
